Experimental Civics announces Capsule Hack, a civic hackathon and conference to inspire new ways tech can help curb climate change

(AUSTIN, TX – May 12, 2020) Experimental Civics, alongside TechTogether and The Earth Hacks Foundation, are organizing "Capsule Hack" (Capsule), a hackathon and conference staged to bring together up to 10,000 participants from around the world virtually for two days of collaboration and innovation in mitigating the effects of climate change on June 20 and June 21.

All keynotes will be livestreamed along with panel discussions featuring NASA scientists and other sustainability leaders from organizations like World Resources Institute and Techstars.
